COUNCIL SUBMITS GRANT APPLICATION FOR BOOLEROO CENTRE MEMORIAL SWIMMING POOL

Council has submitted a grant application to the Federal Governments funding round 6 of the Building Better Regions Fund.

Initial concept plans in which Council has received have provided an array of options. It is understood based on detailed architectural costings, that a refurbishment of the exiting supporting infrastructure, and a new 25m pool including a new kids pool, can be achieved for an estimated \$3.5m.

If successful with the grant application, the Federal Government will contribute 50% of the project costs. The pool is considered an integral asset that supports our many communities, and an important social asset.

Council received a pleasing number of letters of support which have been used to accompany the grant application.

The Booleroo Centre Memorial Swimming Pool is currently run by a group of volunteers though the support of the Booleroo Pool Committee. Council thanks both the committee, and the volunteers whom help ensure this great community asset is available for use to those in our community.

WILLOWIE TRAILS OFFICIALLY OPENED

20km of remarkable new mountain bike trails at Willowie are now open.

To support the new trails, improved day visitor facilities that include a picnic area, accessible toilets, a refurbished carpark and essential facilities provided for mountain bikers such as tyre pumps.

These new trails contribute to the popular mountain bike trail network that exists in nearby Melrose.

The trails were planned with the help of local mountain bike organisation, Bike Melrose and constructed by South Australian business Trailscapes. Local Port Pirie business Alsanto Constructions completed construction of the day visitor facilities.

All upgrades were made possible through the \$10m Remarkable Southern Flinders project – a partnership between Foundation for National Parks & Wildlife, Northern Areas Council, District Council of Mount Remarkable, Port Pirie Regional Council and Regional Development Australia Yorke and Mid-North, the Nukunu Wapma Thura Aboriginal Corporation and the State and Commonwealth Governments.

THE BLUFF LOOKOUT EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS

The recently constructed and opened Bluff Lookout located within the Wirrabara Forrest area has recorded some very attractive visitor numbers. Traffic counters monitored by Council i that over 3,000 vehicles travelled to The Bluff Lookout. This equates to an average of 40 vehicles per day with Sunday showing the highest average.

These are great numbers, and if we assume at least two people per vehicle, then these numbers can easily be doubled for an actual person count. Council will continue to monitor patronage and is very encouraged with the data it has received to date.

It is data like this that illustrates there was a need for The Bluff, and that tourism within the broader Council area continues on an upward trend. The positive impacts that have been experienced by local businesses has been welcomed, and we now look forward to the flow on benefits of the \$10m Remarkable Southern Flinders project which is now underway.
