ouncil Commits to Developing The Bluff

After years in the making, the District Council of Mount Remarkable has reached a point in which Council has resolved to deliver The Bluff at Wirrabara.

"The people of Wirrabara and the surrounding area have been longing for this moment. Having been struck by disaster by the Bangor fires, The Bluff has been seen as one project in which to give stimulus and growth back to the immediate area" said Mayor Heaslip.

The Bluff project is a unique tourism based project that will allow members of the public to travel to the top of the Southern Flinders in the Wirrabara Forest area by road, in which reaching the top an appropriate viewing platform will be available for people to view one of the most awe-inspiring views of the region.

"The experience is priceless, and every time I take someone to The Bluff to see the view, they are speechless. Most recently I had the pleasure of taking Tony Modra and his family to The Bluff, and their facial expressions said it all" said Mayor Heaslip.

Council has engaged an appropriate contractor after completing an open tender process for the construction of the access road and viewing platform.


Council is aiming for a completion of the project by the end of June 2021, of which an appropriate official opening will be scheduled in time for the peak tourism season of the broader Council area.

Pay your rates the easier way with EzyBill

Council would like to introduce a new system for receiving your rates notices by email, with EzyBill.

EzyBill is a software program that has been designed to send rate notices to property owners by email. To start this process, you will need to create your EzyBill account and register the assessment/s you own in District Council of Mount Remarkable. Your next rate notice/s will then arrive electronically via your nominated email address.

- An activation email will then be sent to you
- Open the email and select to activate your account
- Register your properties and you will receive your future rate notices via email

Following this process, you will receive your quarterly notices through EzyBill. Please note, all other notices, including overdue notices and other Council correspondence, will continue to be sent to your postal address. It is the rate payer's responsibility to notify Council of a change in address, so please ensure that you keep your contact details with Council up to date.

After the 3rd quarter rate notices have been sent, Council will transition to using the EzyBill system exclusively for all rate notices that are to be sent electronically. If you currently receive your rate notice by email and want to continue with this delivery method, you will need to sign up to EzyBill. Please note, once you sign up for electronic rate notices you will not receive a paper copy unless you cancel this service.

CORELLA CULLING – PERMISSION TO ACCESS PRIVATE PROPERTY

Council is seeking property owners permission to have Council representatives (Shooters Group) cull Corellas around the townships of Wirrabara, Booleroo Centre, Melrose, Wilmington, Hammond, Bruce and Port Germein. Township residential properties will be excluded due to public safety concerns.

To request permission for Council to access your land, property owners will need to complete a form available on the Council website (www.mtr.sa.gov.au) or Council Office (3 Stuart St Melrose) and must return by Wednesday 17 February 2021.

Further information about when the process will commence will be sent via email once permission forms are returned.


How to lodge a Customer Service Request (CSR)


