#### Presentation from Regional Development Australia Yorke and Mid North (RDAYMN)

Kelly-Anne Saffin, CEO of RDAYMN presented to the Elected Members an update on the progress of the Remarkable Southern Flinders Ranges project, where \$10 million from Federal and State Government will be put towards creating Mount Remarkable and surrounds into an international destination for mountain bikes and all outdoor enthusiasts.

#### **Asset Management**

Council approved the renewal of its Asset Management Plans for a period of 10 years 2021/22 – 2030/31 in accordance with the Long Term Financial Plan.

#### **Electric Vehicle Charging Station**

Council has approved to put in an Expression of Interest for the Electric Vehicle Charging Initiative to host a public electric vehicle charging services in the Mount Remarkable region. It is yet to be discussed where the station will be installed if successful.



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## COUNCIL COMBINED PROGRESS MEETING



Early March, Council hosted an initial Council Combined Progress Meeting involving all Progress and Development groups within the Council district. Topics discussed included the Council Community Plan (Strategic Management) 2021-2031, Council and community responsibilities, events, projects/grants and volunteer management. These informal meetings are anticipated to occur a couple times a year or as required.

## HARD WASTE PICK UP - COLLECCTION GUIDELINES

- This kerbside collection is only available for properties within townships.
- All waste must be on the footpath by 5.00 pm the evening prior to the pick-up date.
- All loose and smaller items should be placed in a strong box or bag and securely tied.
- Bags or boxes must be strong enough so that they do not break open when lifted.
- Each item should be able to be lifted by two persons.
- Remove mirrors/glass from cabinets, bedroom furniture.
- Do not place other items inside fridges, wardrobes etc.
- Do not obstruct the footpath with items or cover SA Water fire plugs or valves.
- Please separate items, eg paper/cardboard; timber;

- steel (do not place on top of each other) and the area must be kept tidy.
- No items will be collected from inside property boundaries - they must be on the footpath area (If you have a disability that prevents you from doing this, please contact Council Staff as it may be possible to organise other arrangements).
- Maximum total limit of two cubic metres (2m3) of hard waste (equivalent to a 6' x 4' trailer load), per household applies
- The length of any item must not exceed 1.5 metres
- Lay taller items down, do not stack items too high
- Items must be able to be handled safely by two people no greater than 50kg

Clean Green Waste and E-Waste will not be collected as they can be taken to any Landfill or Transfer Station.

### **MELROSE CARAVAN & TOURIST PARK - NEW CABINS**

As part of the 2020/2021 budget, new cabins for the Melrose Caravan & Tourist Park have rolled in, replacing the bunkhouse that was demolished in 2020.

The four new cabins compromise of three buildings; one fitted out for disabled accessibility including fittings in the shower, bathroom and bedroom, a general 2 bedroom cabin, and the third building is two cabins under one roof which can be utilised as two separate cabins or as a family cabin, by opening an access door.

Council and contractors are working to have the cabins up and ready as soon as possible. Connection to utilities such as power, gas, water and CWMS are in progress. Council will be fitting out the cabins and landscaping the surrounds not too long afterwards. A grand opening will be arrange and advertised upon completion.
